"Maintaining the Imitation of God" Ephesians 5:6-14

C.I.T.—Children of the light shouldn't partner with the works of darkness.

C.I.S.—You must not partner with ideologies and actions that stem from darkness.

Purpose—To provide a Christian ethic based on waling in the light.

Introduction—How do we stay faithful in a sin soaked world?

I. Keep a Clear Head vs. 6

- a. Do not be deceived by empty words
 - i. tricked through intellectual arguments
 - ii. Vain words sound smooth and logical; just a lot of verbiage with no truth behind it
 - iii. Ultimately they are empty and foolish
 - iv. Misinformation
- b. In this context, he is referring to arguments that seek to belittle sin in general, and sensual sin in particular.
- c. On account of these things
 - i. Referring back to the romantic perversions
 - ii. Wrath of God is his wrath of judgment against sin
 - iii. Sons of disobedience-those rejecting God
 - iv. Regardless of how lofty the argument, the wages of sin is still death.
- d. Illus.—Echo chamber—want to hear people to affirm what I already believe, Texas AM is the best college football team, don't lose, just run out of time, officials fault, freak accident, etc.
- e. Application
 - i. The world is actively trying to deceive us: media, entertainment, friends, etc.
 - ii. Our wicked hearts want to be deceived, because it allows us to justify ourselves.
 - iii. We can't be deceived because of what it will do to us.

II. Keep a Clean Heart vs. 7-8

- a. Partakers—someone who joins in and shares in something
 - i. Ephesians 3:6—Someone who partakes in Christ by believing/accepting the gospel and following it
 - ii. Here it refers to someone who accepts that deception and trust it with their heart
- b. Darkness vs. light
 - i. Were these things, which means this describes you, not just you were in the darkness or in the light, but you are these things
 - ii. Were and now-before Christ and after accepting Christ
 - iii. Our light is merely the reflection and the presence of Christ in us.
 - iv. Without the presence of Christ, we are darkness, and are not able to clearly discern or know the truth or the way to life properly
 - v. Now that we have Jesus, we are light and can know the truth and how to live properly
- c. Illus.—Blindfolding yourself
- d. Application
 - i. When we as Christians who are light, willingly partake in darkness, we have been deceived in to putting on the blindfold.
 - ii. Maybe we rebel against the Lord and put in on.
 - iii. How do so many Christians affirm and engage in so much debauchery?
 - iv. We have neglected the light and put on a blindfold.
- III. Keep a Christilike Hand vs. 8-14

"Maintaining the Imitation of God" Ephesians 5:6-14

- a. Walk
 - i. Walking refers to the actual actions and way someone lives
 - ii. As children of light-someone who is operating as light instead of darkness
 - iii. According to the fruit/principles of light
 - 1. Goodness—something beneficial in effect, could be stern of difficult/sharp, but beneficial
 - 2. Right or just—conforms to the revealed will of God and appointed by God through His Word
 - 3. Truth—pertaining to the reality behind perception
 - 4. Upright with respect to one another, with God, and with self.
 - iv. According to what is pleasing to Jesus
 - 1. While proving
 - a. Participle means contemporary time
 - b. Proving is testing metal to prove its worth
 - c. Would refer to testing thought and actions to make sure they are worthy
 - 2. Pleasing to the Lord
 - 3. Asking the questions does this thing please the Lord
 - v. Positively we live life with these principles as children of light
- b. Do not have fellowship
 - i. Fellowhsip refers to taking part in or sharing—affirming and engaging in behavior
 - ii. Works of the fruit of darkness
 - 1. Refers to the actions that result from someone living in darkness
 - 2. Opposite of those principles above
 - 3. Not engaging with the people, for we must share the gospel
 - 4. But their works
 - iii. Unfruitful/worthless
 - iv. Ultimately judged under the wrath of God
- c. Expose
 - i. Expose something to the light to see it better
 - ii. Sin likes to be in the darkness, to be covered up, in back alleys and dark rooms
 - iii.
 - iv. If we point it out and bring it to light, we are less likely to engage in it.
 - v. Problem is that this is becoming more mainstream
- d. Illus.—Matthew 18 calling out, and James, confessing sins to one another, confessing to Christ
- e. Application
 - i. The one in light will walk according to it, avoid fellowshipping with it, and expose it.
 - ii. We must confess our sin and call a spade a spade.
 - iii. By ignoring it or engaging in it, we perpetuate it.
