"He Touched Me" Mark 1:39-45

- C. I. T.—Jesus brought great joy to a leper by allowing him to be healed.
- C. I. S.—Jesus will bring great joy to your life by allowing you to approach him to be healed.

Purpose—I want to encourage people to come to Christ.

Introduction—Thanksgiving—Jesus touched my life

- I. **Surprising Approach**—vs. 39-40
 - a. The Leper was responding to the itinerant preaching ministry of Jesus.
 - b. Leper
 - i. Used to describe numerous skin diseases
 - ii. Symbolized sin, considered a result of sin
 - iii. Leviticus 13:45-46
 - c. This leper approached Jesus
 - i. He knew that Jesus could heal him but was questioning if Jesus would heal him.
 - ii. This leper placed genuine faith in Christ.
 - d. Jesus talked with him
 - i. The rabbis would throw rocks and shout.
 - ii. They would avoid at all costs.
 - e. Illus.—Shower to Clean Up
 - f. Application
 - i. Matthew 11:28
 - ii. Anyone can come to Jesus by faith.
 - iii. Jesus wants all to come to him.
 - iv. He wants you, warts and all to come to him.
 - g. Takeaway: If that leper can come to Jesus, so can I.
- II. Shocking Answer—vs. 41-42
 - a. Jesus was angry
 - i. Different words in translations—intended to help understand.
 - ii. He was angry, which led to compassion, thus telling us that his anger was aimed toward the situation of the leper, not the leper himself.
 - iii. Jesus was moved.
 - b. Jesus healed the leper.
 - i. He reached out and touched him.
 - 1. It shows the great love and compassion of Jesus to touch this untouchable.
 - 2. The question was, was Jesus willing; he was.
 - ii. He spoke to the Leper
 - 1. Declared that it was His will.
 - 2. Imperative—Be clean
 - c. Jesus was able to heal this leper.
 - d. Illus.—Father Damien
 - e. Application
 - i. 1 Timothy 2: 3-4; Luke 19:10
 - ii. Jesus doesn't give advice from afar; he comes into your life personally.
 - iii. He will touch you and heal you of your sinfulness.
 - f. Takeaway: If that leper could be cleansed by Jesus, so can I.
- III. **Shouting Alleluia**—vs. 43-45
 - a. Jesus commanded him not to speak of him
 - i. With a harsh word, he cast him out
 - ii. String of commands—tell no one, depart, show, offer

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- iii. It wasn't so much that he wanted him to stay quiet, but that he wanted him to stay focused.
- b. Showing oneself to the priests.
 - i. The priest would examine the skin disease according to the Bible.
 - Once determined to be cleansed, the priest would make a declaration which would make the leper ceremonially clean and would restore him to the community.
 - iii. This served as a testimony to the priests and the community that God did something.
 - 1. Only three where it was cleansed, Moses' hand, Marian, and Naaman

2. 2 Kings 5:6-7

- iv. This would have condemned the Spiritual institutions of that day, because they did not accept Jesus.
- c. The Leper could not overcome his joy with obedience.
 - i. Began to preach, sharing his experience
 - ii. The crowds grew even more and more.
- d. Illus.—Word of mouth from satisfied customers
- e. Application
 - i. Our lives should overflow with joy because Jesus touched us.
 - ii. We cannot help but tell others about what He has done.
 - iii. When we are asked about what we are thankful for, how can this not be #1?
- f. Takeaway: If that leper can share Jesus, so can I.

Conclusion

- He Touched Me
- If you have experienced the saving grace of Jesus, you should rejoice, be thankful, and share it with others.
- Don't you want others to experience that as well?
- If you haven't, I want you to experience it today.
- You can, if you would simply admit that you need Jesus and place your faith in Him.

Leviticus 13:45 "The person who has a case of serious skin disease is to have his clothes torn and his hair hanging loose, and he must cover his mouth and cry out, 'Unclean, unclean! ' ⁴⁶ He will remain unclean as long as he has the disease; he is unclean. He must live alone in a place outside the camp.

Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all of you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.

Father Damian

- Statue outside of the Hawaii Capital Building of Father Damian
- Catholic Missionary to the Hawaiian Islands; In particular, the island of Molokai, a leper colony— 1873-1889
- He died from leprosy.
- He went to serve them, took on their illness, and died because of it.
- Jesus did that and rose again.

1 Timothy 2:3 This is good, and it pleases God our Savior, ⁴ who wants everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

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Luke 19:10 For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save the lost."

2 Kings 5:6 He brought the letter to the king of Israel, and it read: When this letter comes to you, note that I have sent you my servant Naaman for you to cure him of his skin disease. ⁷ When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and asked, "Am I God, killing and giving life that this man expects me to cure a man of his skin disease? Recognize that he is only picking a fight with me."
