"Resurrection Power in the Real World" Ephesians 1:20-23

- C.I.T.—The same power that raised Jesus from the dead, fills the community of believers.
- C.I.S.—As a church, we have access to resurrection power.

Purpose—To encourage connection with Christ and church to empower a bold witness. Introduction—Hurricane power outages

- 1. The LORD Shows Great Power.
 - a. "Mighty working of his strength"—working strength and power of God
 - b. His Power was revealed in Jesus Christ
 - i. Resurrection power—Bringing someone back from the dead
 - ii. Seating him at His right hand—over all authorities, both physical and spiritual
 - c. Why is the resurrection important?
 - i. Proves that what he did on the cross was salvific.
 - 1. Provided a ransom and payment for our sins.
 - 2. If he hadn't risen from the dead, then we would have no assurance that he actually accomplished anything on the cross.
 - 3. Resurrection shows that He does have power over sin and death.
 - ii. Proves that He has power over all things.
 - 1. Includes government, organizations, armies.
 - 2. Includes sins and habits that you can't shake.
 - 3. Includes fears and difficulties.
 - d. Illus.—Rangers game see Juan Gonzalez, Rafael Palmeiro, Alex Rodriguez—because we knew they could do it, we began to expect it
 - e. Application
 - i. His power shown in the garden tells us that if He did it once, He can do it again.
 - ii. He is still sitting on the throne and regardless of the difficulties of life, Jesus is still on the throne.
 - iii. He can fix your life, He can save your marriage, He can deliver your child, He can fix your finances, He can heal your body...
 - iv. He can forgive you of your sin and can save you, because He has won victory over sin and death.
 - v. If you would simply trust Him with your life.
 - vi. We should live with the expectation of seeing the power of God in our lives.

II. The LORD Shares Great Power.

- a. This work of His power that resurrected Jesus, placed Him at the Father's right hand, and subjected everything under Jesus' headship, has practical implications for us.
- b. For the church—dative of benefit—for the benefit of the church
 - i. Church—ekklesia—called out ones—assembly would be called out for democratic business
 - ii. used of the church as a gathering, collective of believers
 - iii. doesn't refer to individuals, but to the group/community of believers.
- c. Power extends to the church
 - i. Church as body—
 - 1. Christ is the head
 - 2. If the head possess something, the whole body has it.
 - ii. Church as fullness
 - 1. Colossians 2:9-10
 - 2. The fullness of God's deity, power, etc. was given to Christ.

- 3. By calling the church His fullness, Paul reveals that the power of Christ flows to the church.
- d. Our connection to the Lord extends His power to us.
- e. Illus.—Lord's Supper symbolizes our connection with Christ and with the church.
- f. Application
 - i. The same power that raised Jesus from the dead, flows through His body, the church.
 - ii. We possess this power, not as individuals, but in the context of the church.
 - iii. Examples
 - 1. Two or more pray about something
 - 2. Whatever you bound/loose
 - 3. Move this mountain into the sea
 - 4. Do greater things than Jesus

Conclusion

- If losing power in physical life is terrible, what about losing power in our Spiritual life.
- This power flows as long as we are connected to the head.
- This power flows as long as we are connected to the body.
- If we are not personally walking with he Lord, we have no power.
- If we are not personally engaged in the body of believers, the church, we have no power.
- Some of you need victory over life, especially your sin.
- Will you trust in Him to save you and deliver you?
